


Land-Grant University SNAP-Ed Survey Results

Overview

The Land-Grant University (LGU) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) Annual Survey provides critical insights into program funding, reach, and impact across the United States. The data collected in August 2024.

Changes in Funding and Scope

- **Program Expansion:** Programs with increases were able to expand service areas, increase scope of work and provide additional resources for existing programs.
- **Challenges:** Some programs experienced stagnant or decreased funding due to staff reductions, operational costs and shifts in fund allocation or new Implementing Agencies.



Community Partnerships and Tribal Engagement

- **Work with Tribal Nations:** 119 Tribal Nations and tribal-serving organizations partner with LGU SNAP-Ed programs across 22 states.
- **Language Accessibility:** Programs provide translated materials in multiple languages to reach diverse communities. (27 languages)



- **Workforce Investment:** LGU programs support full-time positions dedicated to advancing nutrition education and policy initiatives.







Why This Matters
